### A Message from our Pastor



### The Same, Old Story

My oldest son, Jacob, is going to college in the fall. And he'll live in a dormitory, like all freshmen do. And he'll eat in the dining hall, like all freshmen do. And...he'll do his own laundry, like some freshmen do.

It's been a long time since my freshman year of college. But, I do remember doing my own laundry. In our dorm, the laundry room was in the basement (I lived on the third floor).

So, late nights or early mornings were filled with trips each week to the basement, where I prayed at least one washing machine and one dryer stood empty. If I was fortunate to find them available, the trips would begin: Up and down the stairs, back and forth to the laundry room to see if each load was finished washing and then drying. You couldn't predict, it seemed, how long they would take. It was maddening.

That's why I was astonished a few years ago when I learned from a representative of my alma mater that, along with the renovations to the dormitories there, all new laundry machines have been added to the premises. And, along with being free to use (no more quarters in those little slots), when each machine is finished washing or drying, it will send the owner of the laundry an email or text message telling them so!

It was bound to happen, I guess. Much like televisions that can automatically record shows when programmed and automobiles that can tell you verbally which direction to turn, it's fitting that washers and dryers can now save college kids umpteen trips to the dorm basement in order to preserve precious study time (uh huh, right)!

Technology has changed everything.

Well, maybe not quite everything. Some things never change, thank goodness. Like the accounts of Holy Week and Easter! Since those events first happened, Jesus has been placed in the tomb on Good Friday, and the tomb has been empty on Easter morning. And this year, so will these things be true again.

All of the world's technological advances haven't altered the stories of Holy Week and Easter. Jesus was betrayed, arrested, sentenced to death, and killed on a cross. He underwent tremendous suffering to take away the sin of the world and be in solidarity with our suffering. It's the ultimate example of his love.

And, after Holy Week, we will hear again that Jesus is still risen, death has still been defeated, victory has been achieved. The empty tomb is still a gift to us.

One more thing technology hasn't done: It hasn't changed our need to hear the story and accept the gift of new life that comes with it. No gadget or device will do this for us.

There are many elements of life for which we're grateful technology has changed, including computerized laundry machines. Nothing, though, can improve the significance of Holy Week and the magnificence of the Easter story. This month let's all listen and enjoy them again.







### **RAIN GUTTER REGATTA**






### FPC GOLF RETURNS...

We will explore Rachel Held Evans last book that asks candid questions about the stories we've been told—and the stories we tell—about our faith, our selves, and our world. This book is for the doubter and the dreamer, the seeker and the sojourner, those who long for a sense of spiritual wholeness as well as those who have been hurt by the Church but can't seem to let go of the story of Jesus. Through theological reflection and personal recollection, Rachel wrestles with God's grace and love, looks unsparingly at what the Church is and does, and explores universal human questions about becoming and belonging.

The **Thursday Evening Bible Study** is exploring the book of Esther. This well-loved story from just after the end of the Exile describes the origin of Purim, a Jewish holiday similar to Mardi Gras. One of the commentators described it as being "narrated with a ready eye for farce, an appetite for slapstick, and a pervasive sense of the ridiculous." # SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

At its meeting on March 28, the Session:

- Voted to move the 9:00 casual Sunday service outside starting on Easter, April 17. It will continue outside at least through the summer months. In the case of bad weather, the service will be moved into the sanctuary. The 11:00 traditional service will continue to be in the sanctuary.
- Decided to offer credit and debit card payment capability for the Posies for the Pantry flower and plant sale on April 23 to benefit the Shepherd of Hope Food Pantry.
- Agreed to welcome a local Hindu community into our fellowship hall on the evening of April 23 for their celebration of the Hindu New Year. The group met in our fellowship hall for the same purpose back in 2019.
