A Message from our Pastor



Loving Well

Christian writer John Mogabgab has come to see that success in this world comes down to a single, simple, and disturbingly profound question: Have I loved well?

I'm not sure that would be the criterion the rest of the world would use to define earthly success, but I do agree more and more with Mogabgab's sentiment. Repeatedly asking ourselves if we have "loved well" could very well be the most important barometer for finding meaningful success throughout our life journeys.

This past Monday, I sat in front of cameras and lights to answer some questions for a series of videos we are having produced about FPC that will be posted on social media over the next several months. The topics ranged from our worship to our fellowship to our service and to our spirit as a congregation.

When I was finished, I reflected on how I answered the interviewer's questions. And I realized that I concluded just about every response with something about how the people of FPC join forces for the purpose of loving our neighbors. Again and again, I talked about serving, being disciples, and uniting amid differences all for the sake of loving others.

I think that does define us. We're concerned; we're concerned to the point where we want to do something to meet the needs of the world around us. Jesus said, "Love one another." And that's what we aim to do.

The theme for this year's stewardship emphasis is "Taking care of each other, our church, our community." When we make our financial commitments to the work of FPC on November 13, we're in essence pledging to "love well" in 2023. Taking care of those around us—near and far—is one way we fulfill our call to love our neighbors.



In just one fall day, the women stocked the supply pantry at the John Knox Center with donations, heard Mission Co-worker Nancy Dimmock talk about her family's mission work in Africa, and made quilted hearts to share with people in need of hope. And they enjoyed fellowship.

"We are just blown away by the gifts & donated items they brought to support this ministry," said JKC director Bri Payne of the paper towels, dish detergent, markers, gift cards and other items women brought.

"Everyone was very enthusiastic about being together in person again," said PWPET Moderator Becky Thomason, who with Connie Umbach led the donation drive.



The Subversive Practice of Giving Thanks
Diana Butler Bass

If gratitude is good, why is it so hard to do? In *Grateful*, Diana Butler Bass untangles our conflicting understandings of gratitude and sets the table for a renewed practice of giving thanks. *Grateful* shows "it is not impossible to imagine a society based on gratitude. It merely takes courage, creativity, and trust." (Los Angles Review of Books)

We know that gratitude is good, but many of us find it hard to sustain a meaningful life of gratefulness. Four out of five Americans report feeling gratitude on a regular basis, but those private feelings seem disconnected from larger concerns of our public lives. In *Grateful*, cultural observer and theologian Diana Butler Bass takes on this "gratitude gap" and offers up surprising, relevant, and powerful insights to practice gratitude.

- Heard from the Administration Committee that the budgeting process for 2023 is underway. The Session will approve the budget at its meeting on December 13.
- Expressed appreciation to the Church Life Committee for the wonderful Tailgate Luncheon held following worship on October 23. 120 people were served, and attendees very much appreciated the opportunity to be together for good food and fellowship.
- Agreed with the recommendation of the Property Committee to replace two failed furnaces in the sanctuary at a total cost of \$12,500. Funds for the replacements will come mostly from the strategic reserve fund.
- Received an urgent plea from the Christian Education Committee regarding volunteers needed for the Fall-a-palooza (Trunk or Treat) event on Sunday, October 30, from 5-7 p.m. in the church parking lot.
