In the process of moving to a new house, I went through every nook and cranny of my old one and threw away, donated, or packed up every object. In the master bedroom closet, I found again a box of coins from my parents.

They've moved with me from house to house over the years. These coins were new editions from the U.S. Mint, still in their original packaging following their printing.

What value do they have beyond their face value? Probably not much. However, because they came from Mom and Dad, they carry extra value. Gifts given from family and friends make us guard them more despite what little monetary value they hold. Because of the familial bond between us, we clutch on to them and do all we can to preserve them.





Presbyterian Women have been heeding the call to give thanks to God and "to do good to one another and to all" (I Thes. 5:15) since they started organizing as aid societies in the 1700s. The Thank Offering began in 1888 when Eliza Clokey of Springfield, Ohio urged each woman to give one dollar over and above her usual contribution to the Women's General Missionary Society of The United Presbyterian Church of North America. A century later the newly formed Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) adopted the Thank Offering as one of the two grant-making programs of the national organization, the other being the Birthday Offering celebrated in the Spring. Since then, close to \$27 million has been granted to more than 1,600 different projects in the United States and around the world from the PW Thank Offering.

In 2022 the Creative Ministries Offering Committee of Presbyterian Women reviewed 24 Thank Offering applications and selected 10 projects for funding. Eight of the projects serve people in the United States and two are international. In keeping with the Thank Offering bylaws, more than 40 percent of the selected projects are related to health ministries.

Our speaker will be Rachel Penmore and some students from UKirk, the University of Tennessee Presbyterian sponsored center.

We have two Tuesday morning circles which both meet at the church on the Second Tuesday of each month, and one circle on the Second Wednesday of each Month. In October, the meetings will be held on the 11th and 12th of the month. 

The Subversive Practice of Giving Thanks
Diana Butler Bass

If gratitude is good, why is it so hard to do? In *Grateful*, Diana Butler Bass untangles our conflicting understandings of gratitude and sets the table for a renewed practice of giving thanks. *Grateful* shows "it is not impossible to imagine a society based on gratitude. It merely takes courage, creativity, and trust." (Los Angles Review of Books)

We know that gratitude is good, but many of us find it hard to sustain a meaningful life of gratefulness. Four out of five Americans report feeling gratitude on a regular basis, but those private feelings seem disconnected from larger concerns of our public lives. In *Grateful*, cultural observer and theologian Diana Butler Bass takes on this "gratitude gap" and offers up surprising, relevant, and powerful insights to practice gratitude.
